We had 56 counters this year! Thank you. Bring a friend next year!

98 total species Some of the highlights:
Two Peregrine falcons together in Donaldson Park, as well as two Cackling Geese in Johnson Park (both in the Piscataway area). Our group got access to the inside of the Edgeboro dump this year which yielded a Bald Eagle as well as 200 Horned Larks on the top of the covered landfill. The birders in the Raritan Center in Edison found a Barn Owl, a Kestrel and a Woodcock. A Marsh Wren was found in the Cheesequake area. 1900 Rusty Blackbirds were found in Roosevelt Park, Edison. A flock of about 500 Brant at South Amboy, which included one Black Brant. Also seen: a House Wren and a Catbird and a Brown Thrasher.

Even though the individual count was down from 84,000 birds to 67,000 birds, there was quite a few species with count-high numbers. One reason the count was lower was because last year there was a flock of 20,000 robins seen! This year the robins were only at 1200.

These species had the most individuals seen in the Raritan count according to the database at Audubon: Red-throated Loon, Common Loon, Brant, Green-winged Teal, Gadwall, Red-breasted Merganser, Ruddy Duck, Bald Eagle, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Horned Lark, Tufted Titmouse, Carolina Wren, White-throated Sparrow, Rusty Blackbird and House Sparrow

Raritan Estuary CBC Area Overview

Area 1:

Northeast part of circle

North side of Raritan Bay

Includes Perth Amboy, Seawaren, Port Reading, the Arthur Kill River

Area 2/3:

North Part of circle

Woodbridge, North Edison, Iselin, includes Ash Brook Reservation

Area 4/5/6

North side of Raritan River at Piscataway

Includes Johnson Park and Donaldson Park

Area 7

South side of Raritan River, South/ Western part of Raritan circle

Includes South River, Milltown, and East Brunswick (with the Edgeboro dump)

Area 8

South part of count circle

South side of Raritan River and Raritan Bay

Includes South Amboy, Sayreville and Old Bridge

Area 9

Eastern part of count circle

South side of Raritan Bay, from Cheesequake Creek to Whale Creek

Includes Cheesequake State Park

Area 10

Center of Count circle

North Side of Raritan River

Includes parts of Edison and the Raritan Center area

Area 11

Western part of count circle

South side of raritan river

Includes New Brunswick, Franklin, Rutgers/Cook College area, down to start of Farrington Lake

Area 12/13

North part of circle

Include Plainfield and Scotch Plains

These areas used to be all separate, but were combined years ago when habitat was paved over for houses, roads, etc. and there were fewer good birding areas.
